ROMANIANS EXTRADITED

On 5 June, 2006, workers with the **International Police Co-operation Centre** will carry out the extradition of 3 Romanian citizens, convicted for different crimes committed in the territory of our country, and will bring them in Romania at the International Airport "Henri Coanda". Thus:

- from Prague, 14.35 hrs, will be transferred:
 - Ø **FRANȚ DANIEL ROMEO**, aged 34, from Afumați, Ilfov County, in view of carrying on serving his prison sentence of 5 years and 6 months, on charge of theft;
 - Ø **ȚĂROIU MARIUS FLORIAN**, aged 28, from Bucharest, in view of carrying on serving his 3-year prison sentence, on charge of theft;
- from Milan, 14.55 hrs, will be extradited:
 - Ø **SIMINICEANU IULIAN CONSTANTIN**, aged 23, from Iași Municipality, Iași County, against whom Iași Court disposed the execution of a 6-year prison sentence, on charge of robbery and illegal confinement; it is recorded that, on 10.02.2002, he and his accomplice hit a man, robbed him and forced him to come with them to a pawnshop;

The future Europol, the fight against crime and the response in risk situations – issues on the agenda of the Council "Justice and Home Affairs"

On the 1st and the 2nd of June 2006, the Minister of Administration and Interior, Vasile Blaga, will participate in the "Justice and Home Affairs" Council of the European Union, in Luxembourg.

On the same occasion, Minister Vasile Blaga will take part in a reunion of the Salzburg group, organized by the Austrian Federal Home Affairs Minister - Liese Prokop, and in a work meeting with Javier Solana - the Secretary General of the EU Council.

The reunion's agenda includes issues of high interest to Romania on the home affairs area, in the context of our country's future EU accession, at the beginning of next year.

Thus, the JHA Council will adopt some conclusions on the future Europol, following the debates organized by the Austrian Presidency of the Council developed over five months, in view of identifying the most appropriate solutions for enhancing effectiveness of this European organism.

At the same time, the Council could adopt the conclusions on the EU priorities in area of crime countering, based on the Europol's evaluations on the organized crime-related threats – OCTA 2006.

Another question of the meeting agenda will regard the report on the implementation of the EU strategy on countering terrorism and if the EU strategy on terrorists' radicalization and recruitment.

Another question of high interest to Romania is represented by the report on creating a European civil protection force, namely "European aid", which could contribute to the strengthening of the EU response capacity in risk situations.

M.A.I. forwarded all the documents regarding the former Security to NCSAS

The Ministry of Administration and Interior forwarded to the National Council for Security Archives Study (NCSAS) all the documents related to the activity of the former security which were in the possession of the National Archives, has announced the Minister of Administration and Interior, Vasile Blaga, today after the M.A.I. College's Session.

This document transfer took place last Friday, based on an Ordinance of the National Supreme Defense Council, which sets the date of 30 May as the deadline for this activity.

Minister Vasile Blaga has been informed by the *National Archives'* Director General, Corneliu Lungu, that there were forwarded to NCSAS a total of 18 linear meters of archives.

“Now the Ministry of Administration and Interior possesses no documents on the Romanian former Security”, Vasile Blaga has stated.
